Classes will be held Monday thru Friday.

Classes for current year grades 4K through 5th will be held at the Lake Superior Elementary School.

Classes for current year grades 6th through 12th will be held at the Ashland High School.

High School Credit Recovery Classes:

We provide a summer school curriculum for our students that is a great option for them to catch up on credits and graduation requirements. Our summer school program will include credit recovery classes that would help to fulfill these requirements for your student. Dates for summer school this year are June 19th - July 24th from 8am -12pm.

Arrival time:

- Children should **not arrive before 7:45 a.m.**
- There is no adult supervision indoors or outside before this time.
- All students should be dropped off and picked up at the:
 - o Lake Superior Elementary School for current year grades 4K through 5th and,
 - **Ashland High School** for current year grades 6th through 12th.

 - 70 minute combination recess & lunch period
 - Elementary Choose 1 Package per week to build your student(s) summer school schedule (Each package is considered full day/full week)
 - Elementary ½ day option for 3rd & 4th week.
 - o MS/HS Choose from 3 classes per week to build your student(s) summer school schedule (These are not packages, they are individual class selections).

General Guidelines and Procedures

Class sizes are limited and will be filled on a first come, first served basis.

Some class sizes will not be able to be increased due pre-purchased supplies

Some classes will not be able to allow 'last minute' enrollments due to pre-purchased supplies.

Classes are open to all School District of Ashland students.
Unless there is a supply fee for consumable materials there is no cost for district residents.
Out-of-district resident fees are \$50 per class plus any special materials fee if applicable.

Attendance:

Except for emergencies, students are expected to attend all summer school classes. This program is funded through a formula that is based upon student attendance. If the student is not able to attend in the event of an emergency or illness, parents should contact the school office at 715-682-7089 by 8:00 a.m.

Students are expected to attend all of their summer school classes for the entire scheduled class time, so please schedule family vacations and other events accordingly. Students who do not come to the first and second day of class are automatically taken off the enrollment. Students are automatically dropped from summer school after the third absence. If your students decide not to attend, please contact Cheryl Tody at 715-682-7089 so that we can open up the class for others to attend.

SUMMER SCHOOL CLASS INFORMATION:

Class Cancellations: All classes/packages are tentative; contingent on staffing and enrollment. At the end of the enrollment period, if a class/package does not meet the minimum enrollment, all students in the class will be enrolled in a class/package that has space available and in a similar subject. Also, at the end of the second day of summer school, if a class does not have the minimum enrollment it will be canceled. Parents will be contacted if the class/package is canceled.

- **Ashland High School** for current year grades 6th through 12th.

Materials: If applicable, are listed with each class description. Individual teachers may request additional supplies for the class and will notify you.

• Registration: Registration is <u>online</u> for all classes. Please read guidelines for this process which is provided in a separate section entitled "Registration Information". Registration dates are Monday, April 24th at 5:00 pm through Monday, May 15th at 4:00 pm.

GENERAL INFORMATION AND EXPECTATIONS:

Cell phones: Students may possess cell phones while they are in summer school, but the telephones must be turned off and out of sight during class sessions unless the teacher is incorporating them into the class. They may be used at the start and end of the school day.

Student Conduct: Students are expected to follow the same school rules and standards of conduct which apply during the regular school year. Summer school staff will contact parents if behavior issues occur in the classroom, hallways, outside, etc. If problems continue, the student may be removed from the class and may lose the privilege of attending any summer school classes. There is no suspension, detention or in-school suspension during summer school.

The following behavior expectations supersede the regular school year policies and will result in automatic dismissal from summer school: Possession of any smoking or drug paraphernalia including cigarettes, rolling papers, lighters, etc. Swearing at a teacher or walking out of class. Any illegal activity including harassment or discrimination

Student Dress: Students are expected to dress appropriately for summer school, no swimwear or any other apparel which would detract from the learning environment. Students are required to wear shoes/sandals at all times. Hats are to be worn outside only.

Supervision: Please note that we will not have any supervision available to watch children if they are not participating in a class.

Transportation: The district does not provide transportation for its summer school program. Transportation of students to and from summer school is the responsibility of the parents/guardians. Students must be picked up immediately upon their final dismissal each day. Supervision is not available for students remaining after their last class.

The School District of Ashland reserves the right to cancel classes, add new classes, combine classes, change instructors, make modifications to the proposed class offerings or make any other changes needed to insure the fiscal integrity and/or educational excellence of the program.

Additional Information

- If "Add New" is not next to the package/class you want to register your student in, it means the class is not available.
- If there is a conflict between the packages/classes you will receive an error message.
- Classes fill on a first-come first-serve basis. When a class is full, it will close. There are no wait-lists. Please check back on-line, as sometimes students will cancel.
- If a package/class is canceled you will be notified and your child will be moved to another package/class for their grade level.


- Enr will appear in the Fit Column. Your student is now enrolled in the package/class.

It is not possible to pass a credit recovery class if a student misses more than three (3) classes. Students are considered tardy if they are 5 minutes late to class. Three tardies equal 1 absence. Students are automatically dropped from summer school after the third absence.
